## KUNO - Information for persons reporting the loss/theft of a debit card Why you should provide your card sequence number

KUNO is a voluntary system established by police departments and the retail industry to reduce fraud involving debit card payments.

In order to block your card, your account details will be forwarded to the retailers participating in the KUNO blocking service. We explicitly point out that not all retailers are affiliated to the system. Please also report your card missing to the bank or other financial institution holding your account and check your bank statements. Notifying KUNO does not mean that any misuse of your debit card can be ruled out completely.

Debit cards issued to the same account have different **sequence numbers**. It is necessary to state the sequence number of the stolen/lost debit card or provide it later on in order to ensure that the system is working properly. Otherwise it may happen that all the debit cards issued to the account will be refused for a period of ten days. At the same time, it is the only way to ensure that your data will be blocked permanently by all participants of the KUNO system beyond that period.

Where to find the separate **one-digit** sequence number (between 0 and 9):

Sometimes it is printed on the sales receipt. It also appears in your bank statement (a separate one-digit number following the bank code) after the withdrawal of money from a cash machine/ATM or direct debit purchases. Of course you can also obtain it from your bank.
